


St. Luke's, Cedar Cross Rd. Barbara Ann Prescott


St. John the Divine, Courtenay Kathy Coulthart-Dewey







Joanne Marie Beagle St. Dunstan's, Gordon Head


Honorary Members

Wendy Mae Carriere Diocese, St. Mark's, Qualicum




Sharron Lynn Schumacher Diocese, Parish of Central Saanich

As a Kwakiutl-Quatsino woman, Fran's life has been dedicated to building capacity and seeking justice for Indigenous people. Apart from her current role as Executive Director of the Aboriginal Coalition to End Homelessness (ACEH), Fran is also the inaugural Director of the Office of Indigenous Affairs at the University of Victoria. Her work at ACEH includes developing the Dual Model of Housing Care, which provides culturally supportive housing alongside decolonize harm reduction; this approach is in now in practice at Kwum kwum Lelum, House of Courage and Speqenéutxw (SPAKEN) House, and being shared with Indigenous and non-Indigenous housing providers nationally.

The Diocese is also grateful to Fran for her work with the Wellness House that will adjoin St. John the Divine, Victoria and that will be provide culturally supportive housing for First Nations, Inuits and Metis people at risk of homelessness. Fran's is an example to us of the work of loving our neighbours and respecting the dignity of every human being.


Anglican Church of Canada's Anglican Award of Merit

The Anglican Award of Merit is given in recognition of the Christian witness of lay people who have made an outstanding contribution to the life and work of the Church nationally or internationally. First presented in 1986, the Anglican Award of Merit is granted by the Council of General Synod.

Canon Alexander has served in numerous capacities at the national level, including as Prolocutor and as a member of the Communications Committee, the Strategic Planning Working Group, the General Synod, and the Council of the General Synod. He has been instrumental in developing the governance structure of the Anglican Journal Editorial Board, as well as establishing operational guidelines for the Journal, and has worked to assist Anglican Deacons Canada in developing their strategic plan. We are honoured to present this award to Canon Alexander for his exceptional contributions to the life of our Church.






